1. The Future Tense - You already know two ways to talk about future events. One was is by saying you are "going to do something," using ir + a + infinitive. Another way is to use the future tense. This is the equivalent of "will" or "shall" in English. To form the future tense of regular verbs, you use the infinitive plus the endings below:

-é	-emos
-ás	-éis
-á	-án

The endings for the future tense are the same for -AR, -ER and -IR verbs.

Ejemplo -Yo hablaré (I will speak), tú irás (you will go)

The Future Tense - Irregular Forms (10)

Decir (dir)	Hacer (har)
poder (podr_)	poner (pondr)
querer (querr_)	saber (sabr)
salir (saldr_)	tener (tendr)
valer (valdr_)	venir (vendr)

2. The Conditional Tense - To talk about what you should, could, or would do, use the conditional tense. Like the future tense, the conditional tense is formed by adding endings to the infinitive or the irregular stem. The endings for the conditional are:

-ía	-íamos
-ías	-íais
-ía	-ían

The endings for the conditional tense are the same for -AR, -ER and -IR verbs. Ejemplo – Yo hablaría (I would speak), tú irías (you would go)

Decir (dir)	Hacer (har)
poder (podr_)	poner (pondr)
querer (querr_)	saber (sabr)
salir (saldr_)	tener (tendr)
valer (valdr_)	venir (vendr)
